Introduction

Sponsored Programs is pleased to present the Annual Report for fiscal year 2012. New funding for externally-sponsored projects at EKU totaled \$46,235,013¹ for the recently ended fiscal year. External funding at the University is a reflection of the commitment that faculty and staff have made to the University's multi-faceted mission. We commend those individuals who have embraced the responsibility of pursuing external funding and extend our congratulations to those whose hard work and dedication is represented by the awards presented in this report.

Notable accomplishments resulting from submissions to highly competitive grant programs include the following:

- A National Institutes of Health award to Tanea Reed in Chemistry (the second NIH award in the University's recordable history, following the first last year) for research on the use of Gamma Glutamyl Ethyl for the treatment of traumatic brain injuries;
- A National Science Foundation award to Linda Frost in the Honors Program with science collaborators Walter Borowski, Martin Brock, and Malcolm Frisbie to create an interdisciplinary science course for Honors students;
- A U.S. Department of Education award to Daniel Roush in American Sign Language and Interpreter Education to create TerpTube, an accessible online portfolio for deaf mentors and sign language interpreters;
- A Wake Forest University award to Mike Austin in Philosophy and Religion (through a competitive program funded by the John Templeton Foundation) for a study on humility; and
- A Centers for Disease Control award to Joe Beck in Environmental Health Sciences for conference support.

Sponsored Programs Mission

The mission of the Division of Sponsored Programs is to provide support for faculty and staff in the pursuit of external funding while assuring compliance with applicable regulations. Sponsored Programs provides assistance in the following areas: identifying potential funding sources; developing proposal narratives and budgets; facilitating compliance with federal, state, sponsoring agency, and University regulations; completing electronic applications; submitting proposals to sponsoring agencies; negotiating contracts and other award agreements; accepting award documents; administering post-award non-accounting functions, including subawards, vendor agreements, no-cost extensions, and budget revisions; administering the Institutional Review Board for the protection of human research subjects; administering the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee; and providing workshops on various pre-award topics.

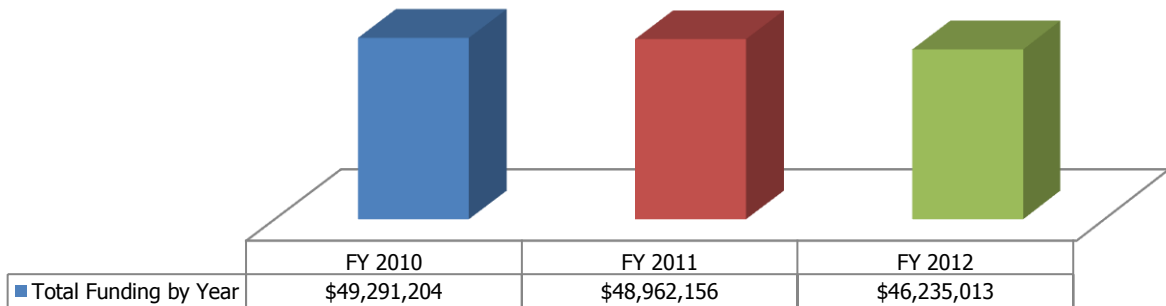

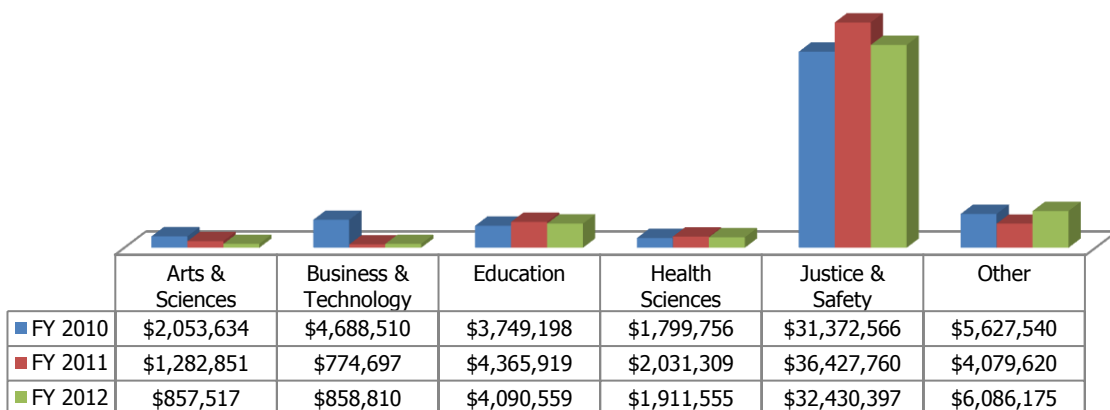
2011-2012 Funding Highlights

Sponsored project funding secured through new awards for the 2012 fiscal year totaled \$46,235,013. The following graphs illustrate the funding trend for the last three years in total and for each college.

Funding by College (3-Year Period)



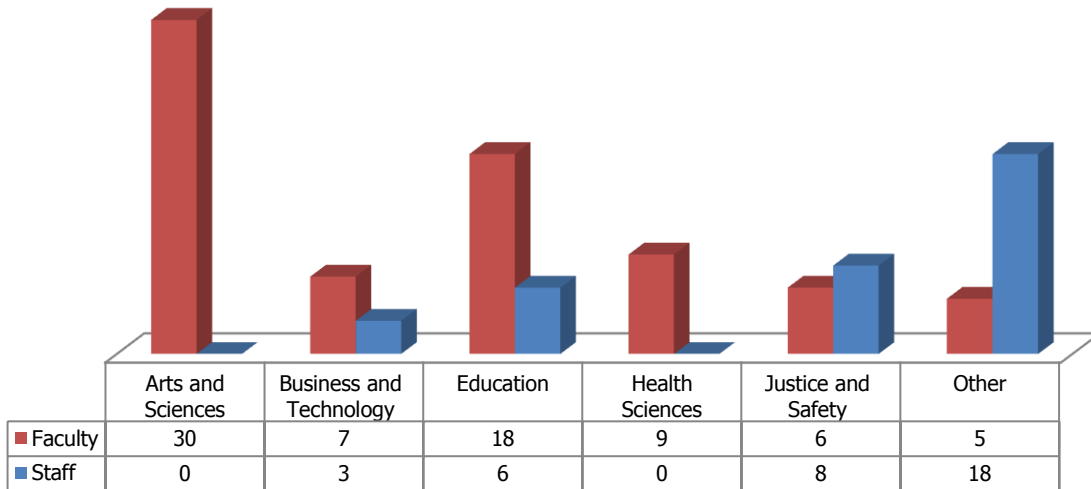
Project Directors on Active and New Awards

Seventy (70) faculty and 37 staff served as project directors or co-project directors on awards that were active during the 2012 fiscal year. Sixty-four (64) faculty and 33 staff served as project directors on 107 separate new awards that began during the 2012 fiscal year. Fourteen (14) faculty and 2 staff served as first-time project directors on new awards in FY 2012.

Faculty and Staff Submitting Grant Proposals

Seventy-five (75) faculty and 35 staff submitted grant proposals during the 2012 fiscal year. Twenty-one (21) faculty and three staff submitted proposals for the first time in 2012. The following graph illustrates the number of individuals submitting proposals during the 2012 fiscal year by college.²

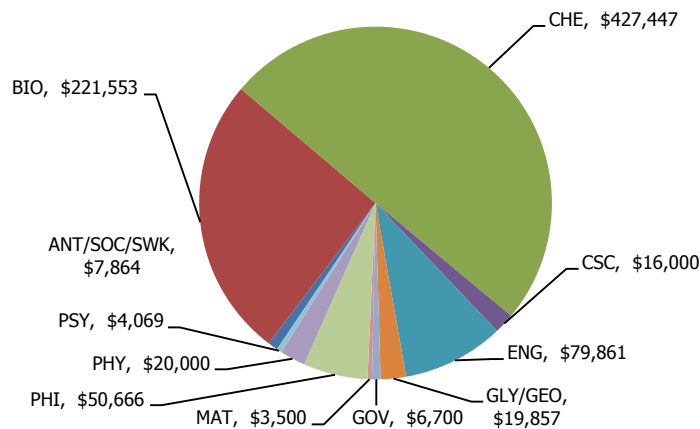
Faculty and Staff Submitting Grant Proposals



College Funding by Department

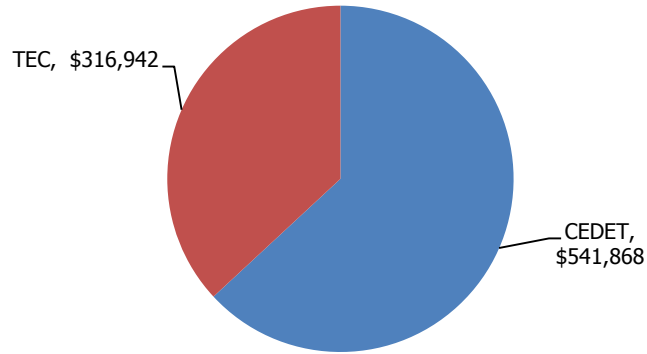

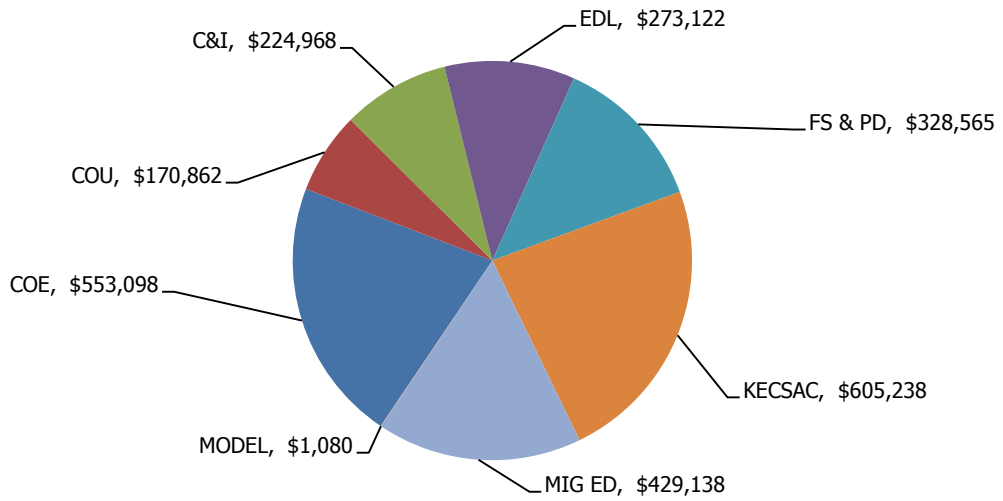

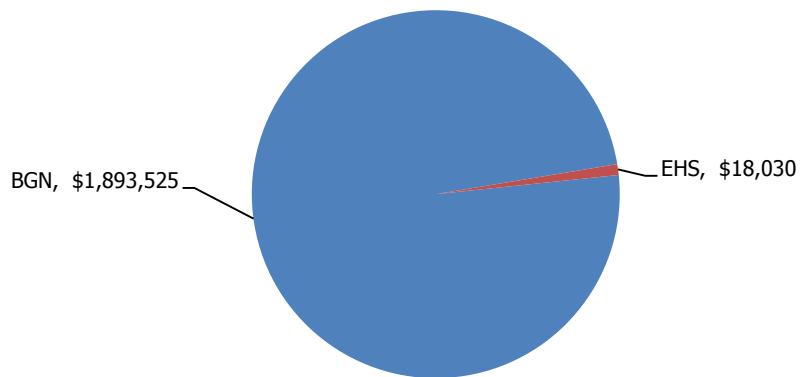

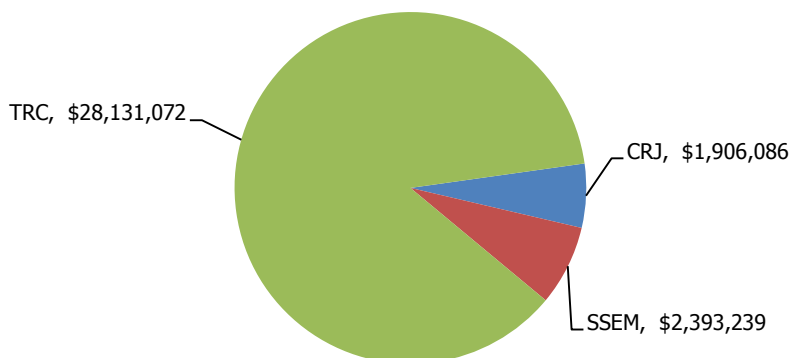

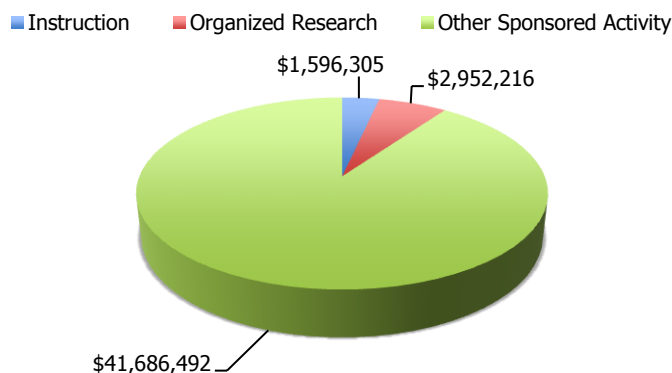

Funding by Function

The majority of funding (91%; \$42,174,185) for fiscal year 2012 was secured for “other sponsored activities,” including service projects. A total of \$2,952,216 (6%) was secured for organized research projects, and \$1,108,612 (3%) was secured for instruction projects. The following graph depicts the dollar value of funding approved for organized research, instruction, and other sponsored activities.

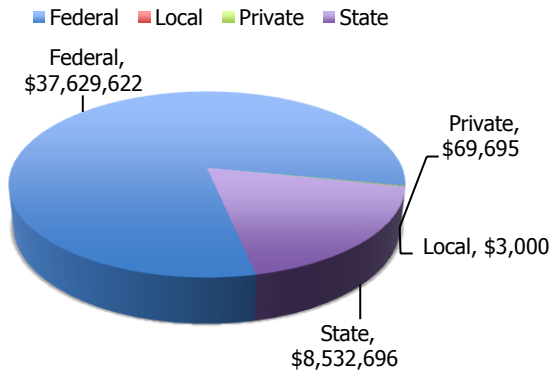
FY 2012 Funding by Function



Funding by Source of Funds

Awards from federal funds totaled \$37,629,622 which represents 81.39% of the total amount awarded to ECU during the 2012 fiscal year. The federal funding total includes funding awarded directly to the University from federal agencies as well as federal funding passed through the State of Kentucky, awarded through subawards from collaborating universities, and granted through other federal pass-through agencies. Notable federal agencies include the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the United States Department of Education, the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, and the Health Resources and Services Administration. State-funded awards represent 18.46% of total funding for fiscal year 2012 at \$8,532,696. Notable state agencies include the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, Council on Postsecondary Education, Department of Justice, Department of Education, and Transportation Cabinet. The remaining 0.16% (\$72,695) of funding for fiscal year 2012 was awarded by local or private sponsoring agencies. The following graph illustrates the breakdown of federal, state, local, and private sponsoring agencies for fiscal year 2012.

The Year in Review . . . Looking Forward

Customer Service

Sponsored Programs seeks to enhance and facilitate the ability of faculty and staff to achieve their goals in supporting the University’s multi-faceted goals by successfully competing for funding from external sponsoring agencies. To accomplish this goal, Sponsored Programs is committed to the dual functions of customer service and compliance. Our objective is to assist faculty and staff in developing quality proposals that will be competitive in external grant programs while also ensuring compliance with federal, state, sponsor, and University regulations.

During the 2012 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs devoted significant time to updating the website to include helpful, easy-to-find information and resources. This effort will continue during the upcoming fiscal year, including the development of a new page containing answers to Frequently Asked Questions.

Faculty Development

Sponsored Programs began offering a semester-long professional development course on developing competitive grant proposals in the fall of 2008. The course is open to full-time EKU faculty and staff who plan to submit grant proposals to support projects to be conducted as part of EKU’s mission. The goal of the course is to provide technical assistance and access to resources in support of future grant proposal submissions. Specific tasks are recommended for participants at the end of each session, and additional one-on-one assistance is available from Sponsored Programs staff throughout and subsequent to the semester of participation. Sponsored Programs plans to continue to offer this professional development course each semester for as long as there is sufficient interest from faculty and staff. During the 2013 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs plans to develop a course resource webpage to provide convenient access to proposal development resources and sample documents.

Sponsored Programs tracks grant activity for all participants beginning with the semester of participation in the course. The following table reflects the participation level since 2008 and results from subsequent grant proposal submissions.

As follow-up experiences for faculty, Sponsored Programs also offers a Grant Development Program and a Revise and Resubmit Program. The Grant Development Program allows a limited number of faculty to apply for a course reassignment for time to work on submitting a competitive external grant proposal. The program requires that faculty complete the Grant Proposal Development Course and identify a specific external funding opportunity prior

to applying. The Revise and Resubmit (R&R) program is available to a limited number of faculty to assist in revising previously submitted external grant proposals that have not resulted in grant funding. The program provides a \$500 professional development award and requires the resubmission of a previously declined grant proposal within one year.

Subawards/Vendor Agreements

A total of 166 subawards and vendor agreements totaling \$8,250,975 were processed during the 2012 fiscal year for a variety of projects and tasks on externally-sponsored projects. Internal process changes were made during FY 2012 to improve efficiency and reduce administrative burden for project directors in requesting subawards, vendor agreements, and amendments to both forms of contracts.

University Research Committee Grants

The Office of Graduate Education and Research, through Sponsored Programs, provides support for faculty to engage in research, scholarship, and creative activities. University Funded Scholarship (UFS) grants are competitively awarded based on the review and recommendations of the University Research Committee (URC). Faculty may apply for up to \$2,000 (\$3,000, effective in FY 2013) for faculty mini-grants to support scholarly and creative activities where resource needs are modest and in areas where opportunities for external funding are extremely limited and up to \$8,000 for major project awards as seed grants for the purpose of obtaining significant external funding. During the 2012 fiscal year, the URC awarded a total of \$57,176 to 13 faculty for a variety of projects. Funding was provided for 6 major project awards and 7 mini-grants.

Sponsored Programs provided two campus-wide training sessions to faculty on writing effective UFS applications and will offer the same during the upcoming fiscal year.

Human Subjects Research Compliance

The Institutional Review Board (IRB) for the protection of human research subjects is responsible for reviewing all research activities involving human subjects regardless of the source of funding. The mission of the IRB is to promote and safeguard research activity that involves human subjects within the academic community. During the 2012 fiscal year, 168 research protocols were submitted to the IRB. Of these protocols, 106 were classified as exempt from further review under the federal Office of Human Research Protections (OHRP) regulations. Fifty-seven (57) were processed through expedited review, and five (5) were approved after full convened meetings of the IRB. These projects represent various types of research involving human research subjects conducted by ECU faculty, staff, and students. A total of 153 individuals served as principal investigators on IRB-approved projects, and 63 faculty served as primary research advisors on student projects. The average turn-around time for the review of new applications during FY 2012 was 10.06 calendar days from the date of Sponsored Programs' receipt of the application to the date on which the committee issued approval.

During the 2012 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs provided training sessions to the campus community on human subjects research compliance and the IRB application process. Campus-wide training sessions were offered, as well as training to targeted student groups. Such learning opportunities will continue for the upcoming fiscal year.

Early in the 2013 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs will release new forms to be used when researchers apply for IRB approval. The process of updating application forms was undertaken as a way to streamline the application process by making requirements clearer for applicants. The new forms are expected to result in the need for fewer follow-up questions from reviewers, and as a result, a more timely approval process.

Animal Care and Use Compliance

The mission of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) is to promote and safeguard activities that involve animals within the academic community. Fourteen (14) protocols were approved by the IACUC during the 2012 fiscal year. These projects represent various types of research and instruction involving animal subjects conducted by ECU faculty, staff, and students. A total of 13 individuals (6 faculty and 7 students) served as principal investigators on IACUC-approved projects, and 2 faculty served as primary research advisors on student projects. During the 2012 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs provided training sessions to the campus community on animal care and use compliance and the IACUC application process.
